Sis. Evans eventually returned to Washington, D.C. and worked for the Bureau of Printing and Engraving, retiring after 19 years of service. She was also director of a nursery school in Washington, D.C. for approximately 15 years. In order to be prepared for this position, she attended the University of Maryland, taking a special course in early childhood education.

Sis. Evans has been a member of the Third Street Church of God for over 30 years, faithful and supportive. She regularly attends Sunday School, worship services, prayer meetings, and is an active member of the Silent Workers, and the Women of the Church of God. Evans working with the Urban Prayer Breakfast, a ministry to homeless individuals in Washington, D.C. For years she and her late husband, Bro. Joseph Evans, provided the prayer hotline for persons at the church; they were busy serving others in their latter years. They always had time to listen and pray.

Sis. Evans is a blessing to her family, to her church, to her community and to everyone who encounters this marvelous woman of God. On January 30, 2006, Sis. Evans celebrated her 100th birthday. On today,
